
Once again, thank you for your unwavering dedication and support for Zayed College for Girls. We look forward to a promising Term Four filled with continued growth and success.





Year 8's were required to prepare a dish from different ethnic groups as part of their Health lesson on healthy eating.

"I am very happy we were able to spend time cooking as a class, especially since it was our first formal time using the food Tech room. It is really a huge privilege. Our group Sumaya, Lamar and I, chose to make an Arab dish called Tabooleh.

Tabooleh is a traditional Arab dish mainly consisting of parsley, burghul and lemon juice. We gathered up the ingredients and got to work chopping the ingredients. Once we had finished mixing that all together, we drained the Burghul and put it in the bowl with everything else. I mixed it for the last time and sprinkled it with tomatoes.

We served the dish to the class and it was a hit! Everyone liked the taste of it especially the lemon-tangy taste, you can't make tabooleh without it! This dish works as a side dish next to main course meals such as Manaeesh (pastry) or Warak Enab (Dolma). Overall, my group and I really enjoyed working together because it included something we all like doing - cooking! I loved this assessment and would like more classes like this InshaaAllah".
