Zayed College for Girls celebrated te reo Maori Week along with its partner language Arabic from the 11th to the 15th of September. Students took part in the Education Perfect Whakataetae Reo Maori (competition) and had a chance to play against students nationwide to explore our tangata whenua's mother language. Furthermore, students focused to build their competency on a selected set of language in class in both te reo Maori and Arabic.

Through play and in class competition, students learned how to use a set of commands useful to apply in their day to day life and at school. These included; take out, put back, give me, take, go, come back, put and pass. Interactive games placed as stations around the class, swat competing, spelling activities, reading comprehension tasks and online Quizlet competing encouraged some good engagement. 



Your answers are confidential and we hope you will answer as many questions as you can.



CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION



KAITIAKITANGA

This week our Quran and Religious studies classes were integrated. Our main focus was educating ourselves on the Maori concept of "kaitiakitanga" which means guardianship of the environment. We reflected on the ethics and practices of protecting and conserving the environment and the natural resources within it, on which people depend.

Looking at kaitiakitanga from an Islamic perspective it is our priority as Muslims who are the Khalifa (trustee) to take care of the environment we live in. Islam considers the environment as a sacred creation of Allah and exhorts followers to actively engage in stewardship.

The Quran provides guidance on the interdependence of the natural world and human existence. Surah Al-An'am (6:165) states, "It is He who has made you successors on the earth and has raised some of you in rank above others so that He may try you in what He has given you." ~ Amira Rashid, year 10



Personal body hygiene

Use a deodorant under the armpits
to reduce the smell of sweat.
Instead of anti-perspirant that closes
the pores of the skin, use deodorant from
natural materials, environmentally
friendly and free from alcohol,
aluminum and parabens to avoid allergies.

Do not apply deodorant over sweat.

To prevent mixing of odors and avoid allergies, use your own loofah to take a shower. Wash the underarm area well with soap and water before using deodorant. Repeat this process when needed.

Clean your body with soap and water daily.


Take a shower regularly, especially after sweating, to prevent the accumulation of sweat, oily secretions, and dirt on the skin.

Do not use school uniforms except at school. Keep them clean. Wash them often, and don't expose them to cooking smells.



Help your child bathe daily with shampoo and soap appropriate for her age.

Dry your body well after washing because humidity helps the skin to become infected. Wash your hands and mouth well after eating.



There are about a million ways your child can feel self-conscious during her school years so it is important to maintain good personal hygiene for body image and social reasons. Teach your child good personal hygiene habits that will help them feel good about themselves and stay healthy. *If the weather is very hot your child may need to change their clothes every day — especially her shirt. It is recommended to have a spare set of uniform.

*Encourage your child to take off their school uniform as soon as they get home and to hang it up to air before she has to wear it the next day.

*Physical Education is compulsory for all students from Year 7 to Year 10. Students are expected to provide and change into the following gear at the start of each lesson:

tracksuit pants plain white T-shirt Sports shoes


*On completion of the lesson or lunchtime sports, the students will change back into their full school uniform.

*We seek your cooperation in ensuring that the students bring the correct gear and participate as best they can. PE gear is also required on mufti days.


*Students will need to keep their PE gear in a sports bag, this is separate from their school bag along with a towel and antiperspirant.

SCIENCE DISSECTION

In science class today, we had the amazing opportunity to dissect a sheep heart.

As a class we first watched a video on all the instructions, steps and safety requirements.

We then got into groups and received the equipment needed. For fun, my friend and I pretended we were performing a real surgery and we named our so-called patient Kharoofi which means sheep in Arabic.

We discovered many different parts of the heart and we located the two ventricles and two auricles. My friend and I took turns to dissect the heart and we both communicated well during the dissection procedure.
