## FROM YOUR KAIARAHI

Bonnie, Nieve, Hannah, Lilly, Greer, Kiran, Amelia and Libby

Hi! Today we thought we would do a 'Did you know?' article about the school history!

Hopefully this will help everyone to get to know the school a lot more!



- Mr Hughes is the first ever male principal and teacher at St John's Girls' School.
- Before the school was established, all the grounds and the old boarding house used to belong to a wealthy family who then sold the house and land to the St John's Anglican Church. They then established our school.
- St John's Girls' School was established in 1917 by the St John's Anglican Church. Soon the church could no longer support the school, and so a new school board was formed and St John's became independent.
- St John's used to have boys at school as well. This was to lift up numbers of students as there wasn't enough girls or income.
- Gilmour House, the old boarding hostel, used to be the actual school. This is because there were not a lot of students so Gilmour House was all they needed.



- Our 120 year old school boarding hostel, Gilmour house, was demolished because of safety reasons. Gilmour House was a lovely 2 storey brick house with 4 dorm rooms called Oreti, Waiau, Aparima and Clutha.
- Our school hall is named after Sylvia Broad, an ex St John's student. When Sylvia passed away she left a huge sum of money in her will for the school and so the hall was named after her out of respect.
- Our school houses, Marchant, Lester, Enderby and Alabaster are all named after past principals.
- We have had nine past principals. Miss Marchant from 1917 to 1919. Miss Lester from 1920 to 1932. Miss Enderby from 1933 to 1938. Miss Nicholson from 1939 to 1968. Mrs Alabaster from 1968 to 1978. Miss O'Donnell from 1979 to 1989. Mrs Lesley Mason from 1989 to 1995. Mrs Trish Boyle from 1996 to 2006. Mrs Brenda Mackay from 2007 to 2021.

We have welcomed Georgia, Amaia and 'Charlie the caterpillar' to the class.






### MACKENZIE WROTE:-

### **STATISTICS**


We have been learning about statistics. We have gathered information about the class and displayed it on bar charts. This has been part of getting to know one another.

Next week we will have a trip to Queens Park aviary to start our inquiry topic on animals that fly.


We can't believe we have had four weeks at school already. Time is flying by.


























# **ROOM 3 NEWS**


