2024 Senior Learning Packages

We are excited to announce the introduction of our Year 7 and 8 Learning Packages next year.

Our Year 7 and 8 girls have wonderful teaching and learning in dance, speech and music and this will continue in 2024, while also making way for an exciting new learning opportunity for each girl.

Dance, Speech and Music will continue in Terms One and Two for these girls, timetabled weekly like normal. Dance and speech exams will be scheduled for the end of Term Two.

Towards the end of second term the Year 7 and 8 girls will be given a choice of four Learning Packages to choose from; one package for Term three and another for Term Four. We are offering four exciting packages each term so that two classes are split four ways, in order to make for intensive and concentrated learning with a small number of girls.

We want to offer four packages that are quite different in content and delivery, so that the girls can tailor their learning towards their areas of passion, skill and/or curiosity. We recommend choosing two guite different packages in order to make the most of curriculum diversity.

Examples of packages could be:

- The Body and its Performance Physical Education, Health, Mathematics
- Global Minds in the Community Social Sciences, Science, Literacy
- Performance Showcase The Arts (Dance, Music, Drama), Technology
- Design Creativity Technology, Visual Arts, Mathematics

The girls will be asked to carefully read through the information provided to them in Term Two, along with parents, in order to make the right individual choice.

Each girl will be required to rank the options in order of preference. Every endeavour will be made to provide either the first or second choice.

This is an exciting new initiative and we very much look forward to seeing what our girls take from such fantastic opportunities!

Year 5-6 Camp 2024

We are excited to let you know that from next year we will have a combined Year 5-6 camp! The venues will alternate each year between Camp Columba and another location, yet to be advised. This is a fantastic outdoor adventure experience and we are thrilled to be able to have more girls experience it. More information will come home towards the end of the year.






Some of our holiday Cinquain poems.


They follow a set of rules for each line.
