ATTENDANCE

It is really important that your child attends school regularly. Attendance has the biggest impact on student achievement and I know we all want each child to do well. Please be aware that if your child is sick for more that 3 days we require a doctors certificate.

Our latest data shows that 55% of students are attending school 90%-100% of days open. 30% of students are attending between 80%-90% and sadly 16% are attending less that 80% of days.

The easiest way to think of attendance is absences per fortnight. 90% attendance is 1 day away out of two weeks of school. 60% attendance would then be 4 days away in a two week period. This shows how much learning would be missed if your child only attends 60%. If you need help supporting your child's attendance please reach out to the Senior Leadership team or speak to your child's teacher.

If you have a child due to start with us in the next few years please pop in to the office and let us know. This information helps us to plan for the future.






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CELEBRATING THE WONDERFUL ROOM 4
