




St Mary's Religious Education Newsletter Week 8 - Term 4

Advent:





Lasting four weeks, Advent serves as a period of reflection, penance, and joyful expectation. The liturgical colour for Advent is purple, symbolizing penance and royalty, with a rose-colored candle lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, representing joy.

During Advent, Catholics focus on the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. Traditionally, an Advent wreath with four candles, one for each week, is used as a visual reminder of the approaching celebration. Each candle represents a specific theme, and as the weeks progress, additional candles are lit, symbolizing the increasing light of Christ.

It is a time of spiritual preparation, encouraging christians to reflect on the significance of Christ's first coming and to eagerly anticipate His promised return. As we journey through Advent, may the season inspire hope in our hearts and a renewed commitment to living out the message of Christ in our daily lives!

Reading Summories



- First Reading:

Isaiah 2:1-5

This passage is a poetic and prophetic passage that envisions a future time when all nations will come to the mountain of the Lord to learn from Him. The passage speaks of a time of peace and harmony, where weapons of war will be turned into tools for agriculture, and nations will no longer engage in conflict. The vision is one of universal peace and the establishment of God's righteous kingdom on earth. This passage is often interpreted as a vision of the Messianic era when God's reign will bring about a transformation of the world into a place of justice and tranquility.

- Second Reading:

Romans 13:11-14 is a passage where the Apostle Paul urges believers to recognize the closeness of salvation. He advises them to cast off sinful behavior, live in the light of Christ, and be morally vigilant in anticipation of the imminent return of Christ and the establishment of God's kingdom.

- Gospel Reading Matthew 24:37-44

Matthew 24:37-44 is a passage where Jesus speaks about the unpredictability of His second coming. He uses the analogy of Noah's time, emphasizing that people should be spiritually prepared, as His return will be sudden and unexpected. The message is to stay watchful and ready for the coming of the Son of Man.

1st Sunday of Advent GOSPEL PRAYER

Heavenly Father,

As we enter the sacred season of Advent, we echo the words of Your Son urging us to be watchful and stay awake, for we know not the hour of His return. Grant us the grace to be vigilant in faith, to let the light of Christ dispel the darkness of doubt, and to be faithful stewards of the time and talents You have given us. As we eagerly anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth and await His promised return, may this season be a time of deep reflection, connection with You, and a renewed commitment to living out the Gospel message. May the lighting of the first Advent candle signify the growing anticipation and preparation in our hearts. In the name of Jesus Christ, who came, who comes, and who will come again, we pray.
