

All Saints and All Souls

All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day are two significant observances in the Catholic calendar that are dedicated to remembering and honoring the departed, but they have distinct purposes and traditions.

All Saints' Day (also known as All Hallows' Day) is celebrated on November 1st. It is a day to commemorate all the saints, known and unknown, who have attained heaven. Saints are individuals who have lived exemplary lives of holiness and are believed to be in the presence of God. On this day, Catholics honor these saints and seek their intercession. While some saints have their dedicated feast days, All Saints' Day collectively celebrates the countless saints who may not have specific feast days. In many cultures, it's customary to attend Mass, and churches often display relics or statues of saints. People might also visit cemeteries to pray for the souls of their loved ones who have passed away.

All Souls' Day, which follows on November 2nd, is a day to remember and pray for all the faithful departed souls, particularly those in Purgatory. Purgatory is a temporary state where souls undergo purification before entering heaven. Catholics believe that through their prayers and acts of devotion, they can help expedite the souls' journey to heaven. On All Souls' Day, Catholics often attend Mass and visit cemeteries to pray for the souls of the deceased. It is common to light candles and offer special prayers for the repose of the souls in Purgatory, asking God to grant them mercy and forgiveness.



Together, these two days serve as a time of reflection on the afterlife, the communion of saints, and the interconnectedness of the living and the deceased. They offer an opportunity for Catholics to remember and honor not only the known saints who serve as role models but also their departed loved ones who may be in need of spiritual support on their journey to eternal life.






Remembering Parihaka

- 5th November

Parihaka Day is a commemoration in New Zealand that honors the peaceful resistance and resilience of the Parihaka community, an indigenous Māori village, in the face of unjust land confiscations and colonization during the 19th century. It celebrates the spirit of nonviolent protest, cultural preservation, and the ongoing pursuit of justice and reconciliation between Māori and the New Zealand government. Parihaka Day serves as a reminder of the historical struggles of the Māori people and their commitment to peaceful resistance and cultural preservation.

31st Sunday of Ordinary time - 5th November Reading Summories



- First Reading:

Malachi 1:14B-2:2B, 8-10... God rebukes the priests of Israel for offering impure and blemished sacrifices, which dishonor God. He warns them of curses and consequences if they do not change their ways, emphasizing the importance of sincere worship and the responsibility of the priests in maintaining the sanctity of their offerings.

- Second Reading:

Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13: In these verses, the Apostle Paul expresses his deep affection for the Thessalonian Christians. He describes how he and his companions were gentle among them, caring for them as a nursing mother cares for her children.

They shared not only the Gospel but also their lives, and their love for the Thessalonians was evident. Paul commends the Thessalonian believers for receiving their message as the word of God, not merely as the words of men. He emphasizes that the Word of God, which they received, was powerful and effective in their lives, producing faith and transformation. This passage underscores the strong bond between Paul and the Thessalonians and the profound impact of the Gospel message in their lives.

- Gospel Reading

In Matthew 23:1-12, Jesus addresses the crowds and his disciples, warning them about the scribes and Pharisees. He acknowledges their authority in interpreting and teaching the law of Moses but criticizes their hypocritical behavior. They emphasize their status and demand special privileges while neglecting the core principles of justice, mercy, and faithfulness. Jesus teaches that true greatness lies in humility and service, not in seeking titles or honor. He encourages his followers to be humble, for those who exalt themselves will be humbled, while those who humble themselves will be exalted. This passage underscores the importance of genuine humility and service in the Christian faith.
