This is confirmed for Wednesday 11th October – enrolment forms will be coming home shortly. These will need to be returned to the office for registration.






BAPTISM PREPARATION

PUTĀRURU SCHOOLS WINTER SPORTS - 7 A-SIDE TOURNAMENT

Wednesday 16th August (postponement date Thursday 24th August)

The focus for this tournament is participation and "relating to others" – students from all schools will be put into mixed 7 a-side teams on the day, and will compete against one another as teams, as opposed to competing as schools. This will enable students to get to know one another and also to possibly participate in a sports code that they don't usually play in the weekend competition.

Expectations for the Event:

- Students must be 8 years and over to attend this sports day
- Sports offered in the tournament will be rugby, soccer and netball
- There will be mixed teams of boys and girls for each sport
- Students will need to be at the venues by 09:30am for a prompt start at 10:00am
- Expected finish time for the day is 2:00pm
- Referees will be senior students from Putāruru College plus schools may be required to have a parent available for each code to referee throughout the day
- Teachers will be in attendance but parents will need to assist with supervision at each venue to support students, deal with first aid, or tidy up venue at end of day
- All schools to bring their own first aid kit

The Assumption of Mary

The Assumption of Mary is also known as the Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary or the Dormition of Mary. It is a Holy Day of Obligation (when it is not celebrated on a Monday) and is celebrated annually on August 15.

Every year, Christians celebrate when Our Blessed Mother was taken up into Heaven body and soul at the end of her life.

Even though Mary was assumed into Heaven, she is always with us. Heaven is our home and Mary wants us to be with her and her Son for all eternity. On the Solemnity of the Assumption, let us remember our Mother who is in Heaven and who loves us very much. The Assumption is the fourth Glorious Mystery in the Rosary. So, every time we pray the Rosary we can remember that she is always with us and that she loves us more than anyone else on earth could

19th Sunday of Ordinary time - 13th August Reading Summories



- First Reading:

In <u>1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a</u>, the prophet Elijah, feeling disheartened, seeks refuge on a mountain. God questions Elijah's presence, prompting him to share his concerns. Despite the display of powerful elements like wind, earthquake, and fire, God's presence isn't found in them. Instead, a gentle whisper captures Elijah's attention, leading him to recognize that God is speaking softly, and he responds with reverence.

- Second Reading:

In <u>Romans 8:28-30</u>, the apostle Paul expresses his deep anguish for his fellow Israelites, wishing he could be cut off from Christ if it meant their salvation. He highlights the blessings given to the Israelites, such as adoption, the covenants, the law, and the promise of Christ's lineage. Paul emphasizes that Christ, who is God over all, be blessed forever.

- Gospel Reading

In <u>Matthew 14:22-33</u>, Jesus feeds a multitude with five loaves of bread and two fish, he tells his disciples to go ahead in a boat while he stays behind to pray. During the night, a strong wind and rough waves distress the disciples' boat. Jesus walks on water towards them, and when they see him, Peter asks to come to Jesus on the water. As long as Peter focuses on Jesus, he walks on water too, but when he becomes afraid and doubts, he begins to sink. Jesus saves Peter, and they both get into the boat. The disciples recognize Jesus as the Son of God and worship him.

Just as You stretched Your hand to save Peter from sinking, extend Your loving hand to guide us through life's challenges.
