#### **School Lunches**

Our School lunch menu has quite a few changes this year and we are able to change lunches if we find that the children do not like a particular meal. If your child has 'opted in' for school lunches they will receive a lunch everyday. If they do not eat the lunch at school we ask that they take it home (This is so that whānau know that your child has not eaten and may be extra hungry)

#### Camps

We have camps planned for our senior students this year. Year 4/5 students (Totara and Ngaio classes) will be going on camp on Monday 26th February, returning on Wednesday 28th February. Year 6/7/8 (Kauri, Nikau and Manuka classes) will be going on camp on Monday 8th April, returning Wednesday 10th April. Both camps will be at the Coopers Beach Christian Camp. Children will be involved in activities in the local area and also travelling to Cape Reinga for a day trip.

If you were wanting to stay overnight on either of these camps and have not yet completed a police vetting form you may be able to have it processed by the camp dates, forms can be collected from the school office. Only whanau who are police vetted are able to stay overnight on school camps.

Junior classes will be involved in a range of fun activities and day trips during week 5 (more information will follow)

#### **Attendance**

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. As we enter 2024, every day of school matters.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent for a day or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, talk to us! Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school and building a culture that fosters excellent attendance by having:

- School staff who have strong relationships with students and whānau.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who they are, where they come from and who they want to be.
- A school community that does everything to make sure students are at school, and they are participating, and progressing in their education.

#### **New Bell Times**

We have changed our bell times slightly for the start and end of the day to fit in with new bus times. The bell for the start of school will ring at 8.40am (we are hoping the Taipa bus will be at school by then) In the afternoon the bell will ring for the end of the school day at 2.25pm. the Taipa bus will leave school then so children will be at 'drop off stops' 5 minutes earlier. Whanau who pick children up from school can do so from 2.25pm. Children on the Taupo Bay/Taratara bus will leave school at 2.40pm
