


## Playground

## Curriculum/TOD 29th April

Last year a refreshed curriculum was launched in Aotearoa, starting with Aotearoa histories, followed by Social Sciences, English and Mathematics. All teachers across NZ are starting to use the refreshed curriculum and have been learning about how it is different from the 2007 curriculum. The Ministry of Education has given all schools in NZ two extra teacher only days to spend time understanding and planning for this. In September there will be three more learning areas released (science, technology and the arts) with health and physical education and learning languages released in 2025. Schools and kura will have until early 2027 to begin using the fully refreshed curriculum. In Te Hiku o Te Ika most schools have chosen to work together to share ideas and planning that will best support out tamariki. We are also meeting in the school breaks to do the same in our own time.
