I could hear my light breathing as everyone fell into a deafening silence.

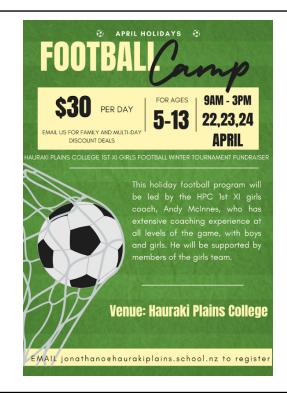
I could smell the freshly produced air that had bounced off the trees and into my lungs.
