



### **CLASS SPOTLIGHT THIS WEEK: ROOM 5**

Sizzle, bubble, pop! It's all been happening in Room 5. We started Wednesday with the most exciting and engaging science display, watching Science in a Van. We rushed back to our classroom to become volcanologists - scientists who study volcanoes. We know that there are 3 main types of

volcanoes. Composite (strato) volcanoes have steep sides and have the most violent eruptions. Cinder Cone volcanoes are circular or oval volcanoes, and they are not usually dangerous. Shield volcanoes have wide, gently sloping sides and are usually not violent. We had so much fun making each of these volcanoes and creating eruptions. We also know about active, dormant and extinct volcanoes.



### **A highlight of Term 2 was our EOTC day**

We had an action-packed day at Miranda Holiday Park. It included racing around the BMX bike track, braving the flying fox, challenging each other to mini golf, frisbee golf, and giant chess, not to mention the playground and a super soak in the hot springs. We finished the day with a scavenger hunt that ended at the office, where we chose an ice cream. As a thank you for having us we have made clay fairy doors for them to put in their enchanted forest



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
