A huge thank you to parents and caregivers who were able to make arrangements to have their children collected from school a little earlier last Thursday.

New Zealand primary teachers held paid union meetings to discuss a new collective agreement and a recent pay offer from the Ministry of Education.

This was a valuable opportunity to come together in unity, to discuss the issues and decide on next steps.

We all want the very best for children, and we want to make changes that benefit all children now and in the future.

Thank you to Sharron, Tania, and Susan for holding the fort back at school.

We truly appreciate everyone's support.

Why the Meeting?

The primary teachers' union, NZEI Te Riu Roa, had rejected a pay offer of a 1% increase per year over the next three years.

The union and its members considered this offer to be "insulting" and a de facto pay cut, as it falls well below the current rate of inflation.

In addition to pay, teachers are also concerned about other issues, including:

- The government's decision to scrap their pay equity claim. This was an important issue for a profession where a large majority of the workforce are women.
- A lack of progress on addressing the protection of Te Tiriti
 o Waitangi within their collective agreement.
- Insufficient support for students with additional learning needs. Teachers feel that promises to address this issue have been vague or pushed into the future.
- General feelings of being undervalued and disrespected for the work they do.





We are celebrating a truly outstanding performance at the new Hauraki Kāhui Ako Mathex Competition. Our students showcased their mathematical prowess, teamwork, and problem-solving skills, bringing home a win in both the Year 7-8 and Year 5-6 competitions.
