





# EVENT SPOTLIGHT Room 7 Visit the Young's Stream

On Friday, Room 7 set off on an exciting adventure to Mr and Mrs Young's farm to be real life scientists and explore the health of a local stream. Working in small groups, students rotated through a series of science stations led by expert ecologists and scientists from the Waikato District Council, Enviroschools, and EcoQuest.

At each station, we investigated different aspects of stream health — testing the clarity, temperature, and conductivity of the water, measuring the stream's flow, and observing its shape and signs of erosion. We also observed the streambed materials and caught macroinvertebrates to study under magnify glasses.

The students were thrilled to discover lots of mayflies, which are a good indicator of a healthy stream, as well as several kõura (freshwater crayfish). This showed showed that the stream's ecosystem is thriving!

A huge thank you goes to **Kelly Deihl** for organising this wonderful learning experience, and to our amazing parent and grandparent helpers for joining us on the day. It was a fantastic hands-on science adventure that helped Room 7 become real environmental scientists!
