#### JUNIOR MATARIKI ROTATIONS AND CELEBRATIONS

It was wonderful to see the Juniors engaging in various activities to commemorate this special occasion. Each pair of classrooms had a different activity organised:

Making Lanterns: Creating lanterns is a great way to symbolise the guiding light of Matariki and the stars. These lanterns were decorated with Matariki related symbols and designs, reflecting the cultural significance of this event.

Matariki Art: Artistic activities can help the Juniors express their creativity and understanding of Matariki. They created pastel drawings inspired by the Maori New Year.

Learning about Hiwa-i-te-rangi: Hiwa-i-te-rangi is a

specific star associated with Matariki and is known as the wishing star. The Juniors learned about the cultural significance of this star and made their own wishes during the celebration.

Making a Korowai with Feathers: A korowai is a traditional Māori cloak adorned with feathers. Creating a class korowai together fosters a sense of unity and collaboration amount the Juniors, and it's a beautiful way to honour Matariki's cultural heritage. The Juniors have learned some Te Reo kupu (words) related to Matariki and incorporated them into their activities.

These activities not only provide a fun and engaging way for the Juniors to celebrate Matariki but also help them to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of Māori traditions and culture. By participating in these activities, they are likely to develop a stronger sense of cultural awareness and respect for the indigenous heritage of New Zealand.

### REMINDERS

It is really important for children to create good routines and part of this is arriving to school on time in the morning so they can be ready for their day.
