

Due to the heavy winds over the weekend we arrived on Monday to find a lot of fallen branches littering the Senior Playground. It was fantastic to see most classes went out during the day to pick up the branches so they didn't cause a hazard when children were using the fields and playgrounds. Arborists are regularly employed to remove dangerous branches, dead wood and 'hangers' from the trees around our playgrounds, however the Strong cyclone winds still brought down quite a bit of wood. Unfortunately we have had to close our Scooter Track temporarily due to a tree being damaged and we are now waiting for an Arborist to come and remove this so it is safe for our children.
